[Savannah’s Nondiscrimination Ordinance](#)

The right of an otherwise qualified person to be free from **discrimination** because of that person's actual or perceived race, color, [religion](#), [national origin](#), ancestry, sex, [sexual orientation](#), [gender identity](#), [age](#), disability, [marital status](#), [familial status](#), or [veteran/military status](#) is recognized as and declared to be a civil right. This right shall include, but not be limited to, all of the following:

1. The right to obtain and hold employment and the benefits associated therewith without **discrimination**.
2. The right to the full enjoyment of any of the accommodations, advantages, facilities, or privileges of any [place of public resort, accommodation, assemblage, or amusement](#) without **discrimination**.
3. The right to engage in property transactions, including obtaining housing for rental or sale and credit therefor, without **discrimination**.
