Savannah's Nondiscrimination Ordinance

The right of an otherwise qualified person to be free from <u>discrimination</u> because of that person's actual or perceived race, color, <u>religion</u>, <u>national origin</u>, ancestry, sex, <u>sexual orientation</u>, <u>gender identity</u>, <u>age</u>, disability, <u>marital status</u>, <u>familial status</u>, or <u>veteran/military status</u> is recognized as and declared to be a civil right. This right shall include, but not be limited to, all of the following:

- 1. The right to obtain and hold employment and the benefits associated therewith without discrimination.
- 2. The right to the full enjoyment of any of the accommodations, advantages, facilities, or privileges of any <u>place of public resort, accommodation, assemblage, or amusement</u> without <u>discrimination</u>.
- 3. The right to engage in property transactions, including obtaining housing for rental or sale and credit therefor, without discrimination.
