

FOUNDING STORY

SAVANNAH'S LGBT+ CENTER



HISTORY

Founded in 2017, the Savannah LGBT Center re-branded in 2020 as First City Pride Center following the merger of Savannah's historic LGBTQIA+ organizations, Savannah Pride and Standout Youth. The new name represents the respected legacies of First City Network, Georgia's oldest queer organization and founding partner of the LGBT Center, and Savannah Pride.

As the only LGBTQIA+ Georgia based Center, FCPC serves as a fulcrum for programming and services in Coastal Georgia and continues to lead with groundbreaking efforts like our Prism Clinic mental and behavioral health center, Support Groups, Savannah Pride Festival, and Parade. FCPC started with a vision for a volunteer-run community center that offered vital services through partnerships with like-minded organizations. Our successful advocacy secured comprehensive non-discrimination protections in the City of Savannah, a pioneering achievement in Georgia outside metro Atlanta.

In 2021, we hired our first Executive as FCPC migrates to a professionally led nonprofit organization better suited to address the expanding needs of Coastal Georgia's LGBTQIA+ community. FCPC's long-term plan includes developing an affirming safe space training for K-12 and Higher Education schools and LGBTQIA+ inclusivity training for local organizations. Together, we aim to build a more robust, connected, and just community.






FOR THE YEAR OF 2022

FCPC's Prism Clinic is an outpatient behavioral healthcare service center and a branch of Georgia Southern University's Psychology Clinic. Services provided at the Prism Clinic include individual, family, couple, and group psychotherapeutic care and psychological assessment, outreach, and advocacy-based practices — all geared toward supporting wellness and well-being within the local LGBTQIA+ communities. Care services are primarily accessible and affordable. Clients receive five sessions free with only a \$5 charge for each subsequent session in person at the Center or via Telehealth. In Fall 2022, we expanded from one provider to three, increasing the number of clients served.

YOUTH GROUP

FOR THE YEAR OF 2022

First City Pride Center helps connect and support LGBTQ+ youth in Savannah. In 2022 we started a bi-weekly youth group for ages 12–18. To help with return rates for homeschooled students outside of the downtown area or who do not have transportation, our Youth Group in 2023 will be held weekly, alternating between in-person and virtual groups.

HIV TESTING

Starting in 2023 our HIV Testing Services return in collaboration with Mercer University.

RESOURCES & REFERRALS

Our Front Desk specializes in providing affirming resources and referrals to the Savannah community. We have curated eight community-vetted resource directories covering medical providers, mental health providers, job discrimination, legal services, transgender resources, food insecurity, housing and unsheltered, and crime and domestic violence.

SERVICES

PROGRAMS, SUPPORT AND SOCIAL GROUPS

TRANSFAM

Transfam is a weekly support group for transgender, trans+, non-binary, gender-nonconforming, and questioning people and friends, family, and allies. The group meets twice a week, inperson and virtually. At meetings, clients discuss issues, thoughts, feelings, milestones, and successes. Members include all ages, from teens to seniors.

All identities on the gender diverse spectrum are supported; transmasculine, transfeminine, non-binary, questioning, and non-transitioning people at any point in their journey, regardless of how that is explored in their lives. The group is facilitated by community members who have completed training sessions with a transgender therapist.

GAME NIGHT

LGBTQ+ individuals socialize over board games and table top RPGS. 10+ group members participate weekly.

EVENING PRAYER

Run by Epiphany Episcopal Church, an open and affirming church that welcomes questioners and seekers. Epiphany provides a safe space for those the church has harmed to reconnect with the spirit without pressure or commitment.

BOOK DISCUSSION

Casual conversation and book discussion. All are welcome. Books are chosen by the group, and either feature LGBTQIA+ themes or authors.

SUPPORT GROUPS

PFLAG

PFLAG is a national LGBTQ+ support organization. PFLAG of Savannah is up and running to provide education, support, and advocate for our LGBTQ+ youth. The monthly support group is open to everyone.

PRIDE FAMILIES

Pride Families Group is a social group for parents or caregivers, and their LGBTQIA+ children ages 13 and younger. The group meets monthly to provide a safe, affirming place for fellowship and for kids to meet and connect over games and stories.


